3. What is the distance between Manchester and Thornton's?
4. The cost of tickets from Nashua to points further south is not shown. Even so, can you guess what it might cost a passenger to board the train at Nashua and purchase a ticket to Little's? How about a ticket to Tyngsborough? Explain your reasons for your guess.
5. Visit the Web site [How Much Is That Worth Today?](#) to learn how much a trip between Concord and Boston would cost in today's money.
6. Research further by visiting Amtrak's Web site to find how much a one-way trip from Concord to Boston actually costs today. (Can you travel by passenger train?) Which is cheaper in today's money, travel in 1849 or travel today?
7. With the help of your parents estimate how much it would cost to drive your own car between Concord and Boston.
